Looking at the Readings

What is Jesus' view of heaven?

He describes heaven as a house with many rooms. In Galilee at the time of Jesus most people lived together in a single room, called an insular, with their animals and possessions.

So Jesus offered them a view of heaven that gave many rooms, therefore privacy, yet able to be close to the rest of the family.

If that were heaven then the audience of Jesus would want that.

So what is your view of heaven?

For somebody born in poverty, heaven might be a place where there would be no concerns about having enough of anything.

For somebody living with violence it could be a place of peace.

For somebody from Alaska heaven would have a fireplace.

So what is your view of heaven?

What would heaven need? Who could go there? Who would you want to spend eternity with?

There are as many heavens as there are people who are led by Jesus. Because without Jesus' leadership, his way, his truth, his life there is no heaven, the most important part about heaven is that Jesus is in it.

We cannot have heaven without Jesus. Jesus and some of the people and things that help us to be closer to God.

The season of Easter leads us to the story of Jesus' ascension to heaven, to wait for our arrival there. Easter is also about acknowledging what Jesus does for us, so that we can make it to heaven, so that there can be a heaven we want to be part of. Jesus began heaven here among us and continued it to beyond where we are now.

His life is an example of preparing the things that will last in heaven. We are called to contribute to making our heaven and the heaven of others.

So maybe the question is not what you need for heaven but rather:

Acts 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith.

'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.
