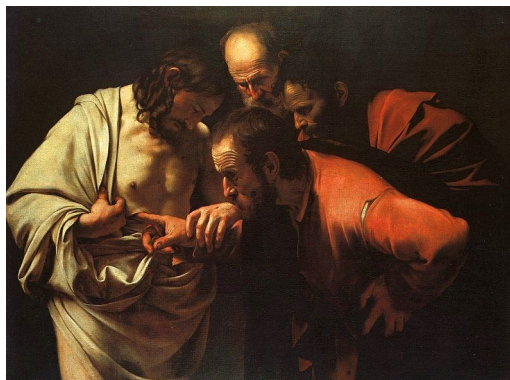


St Mary's Parish Echuca

The importance of today's gospel story is shown by the fact that it led to the original conclusion of St John's gospel. The story proper falls into two parts: the appearance of the risen Lord to the assembled disciples on the first Easter Day and his appearance before Thomas a week later.

John presents Jesus' resurrection, his giving the Spirit and the commissioning of the disciples in a single unified sequence. By contrast, the Gospel-writer Luke introduces a time-span of forty days before Jesus' ascension and fifty days before the outpouring of the Spirit. Each is communicating the same profound truth within a different theological framework.

The text for today can be sub-divided into four parts. In part one, Jesus appears to the fear-filled disciples and greets them with peace. This twofold greeting should be given strong emphasis. Part two consists of Jesus' commissioning the disciples and breathing out his Spirit upon them. Part three relates the encounter between the risen Lord and the Apostle Thomas, culminating in words that implicate us "Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe". The reading comes to a climax with the final summary of the gospel's purpose. "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name".

St. Mary's Social Justice News

Though a small group, the Social Justice Group is celebrating a number of successes in the last year. With great support from this parish, we have sponsored university placements for students in East Timor, raised in excess of \$8,000 for Caritas Australia and provided over thirty street swags for the homeless of Echuca, just to identify a few key projects.

We are now looking to the year ahead and have decided to focus on two key areas in the coming months.

Refugees and Asylum Seekers

In the current climate it is very difficult to grasp the situation of people in desperate need who seek safety in our country. Media and politicians give very confusing perspectives but at the heart of the issue are people who need help.

The Social Justice Group aims to unravel some of this information through an information workshop. With the help of a number of speakers, we hope to:

clarify the reasons why people seek asylum in Australia,

clarify current policies and their ramifications

find out how we can help/support those who need it

Homelessness in Echuca

As Winter sets in and we think of blanket appeals and the distribution of street swags, we are reminded that there are many in Echuca who are homeless. We know that in this area there is an acute shortage of accommodation for people in crisis or on low incomes. The Social Justice Group hopes to uncover the reality of this situation, find out how services in Echuca are provided for those in need of accommodation/services and what we at St. Mary's can do to help.

If you would like to be part of either of these initiatives you would be very welcome.

The Social Justice group meets on the third Wednesday of every month, and covers these initiatives as well as the justice issues that arise through the Diocese and the Church year. If you would like to be part of this active Church group you would be very warmly welcomed.

However if you are especially interested in just one of the above projects without attending the monthly meetings, you would also be very welcome.

Readings from Scripture.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47

The whole community remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers.

The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone.

The faithful all lived together and owned everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions and shared out the proceeds among themselves according to what each one needed.

They went as a body to the Temple every day but met in their houses for the breaking of bread; they shared their food gladly and generously; they praised God and were looked up to by everyone. Day by day the Lord added to their community those destined to be saved.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter 1:3-9

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy has given us a new birth as his sons, by raising Jesus Christ from the dead, so that we have a sure hope and the promise of an inheritance that can never be spoilt or soiled and never fade away, because it is being kept for you in the heavens. Through your faith, God's power will guard you until the salvation which had been prepared is revealed at the end of time. This is a cause of great joy for you, even though you may for a short time have to bear being plagued by all sorts of trials; so that, when Jesus Christ is revealed, your faith will have been tested and proved like gold - only it is more precious than gold, which is corruptible even though it bears testing by fire - and then you will have praise and glory and honour. You did not see him, yet you love him; and still without seeing him, you are already filled with a joy so glorious that it cannot be described, because you believe; and you are sure of the end to which your faith looks forward, that is, the salvation of your souls.
