Reflection

'Advent' means 'coming' and this season reminds us of the 'already' and the 'not yet'. Jesus has 'already' come in his incarnation, and at Christmas we recall the events of his historical coming among us as a babe at Bethlehem. But today's liturgy invites us to consider the 'not yet' which will happen at the Parousia or his second coming.

Jesus will come again to gather everything and present it to the heavenly Father. While waiting for that blessed time, we have to keep awake and attend to our duties as responsible servants of the Lord waiting for his return. Times will continue to be trying, but we are strengthened by our blessed hope and our conviction that the Messiah has come and will come again in glory. Hope

At Jesus' first coming, the angels sang of 'joy to the world'. This joy, Pope Francis reminds us, fills the hearts and lives of people today when they encounter Jesus. This joy will be complete when Christ comes again in glory. At that time God 'will wipe away every tear; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. Australian dioceses were invited to take up a special collection for the people of Ukraine. Money raised was used to support the evacuation of people from frontline territories; Food packages for



people in need; Shelters for internally displaced persons. Though we are now faced with the horror of the war in Gaza the people of Ukraine continue to endure a war that the world is forgetting.

At the Bishops Conference's November 2023 meeting, bishops were asked to again consider if an appeal could be taken for the people of Ukraine during Advent. To this end we will have a special collection on the 16/17th December to donate to the Advent Appeal for Ukraine. Funds will again be directed to *Mudra Sprava* via the Eparchy of Sts Peter and Paul. **You might need to remember to bring some cash to Mass.** Parish Justice Team

Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:1,3-8

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

You, Lord, yourself are our Father, Our Redeemer is your ancient name. Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you? Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down - at your Presence the mountains would melt.
