Reflection

The Book of Leviticus goes into great detail about identifying, treating, and isolating persons with leprosy and other like complaints. Chapter 13 has 59 verses and in Chapter 14 on purification of lepers it has 57 verses. We read a small section today (five verses). Nonetheless lepers suffer physically and socially. The disease in ancient times was also considered a punishment for sins (with religious minded peoples) or retribution for evils committed (with the general populace). We may ask the question today: "Have we shifted our understandings of suffering, adversities and atrocities with wars, pandemics and natural disasters?" When these things happen there are suggestions of divine retribution, lingering accusations and blame upon certain people or social groups.

Early in his ministry Jesus is confronted with people with diseases and the questions: "Whose fault? What sins have brought this on? Is it the sufferers or their parents that caused this?" He responds typically with: It is nobody's fault but the glory of God can be seen in the healing. And in his compassion for the accused, the victim, or the isolated person, Jesus healed them. The healer then gets accused of blasphemy or breaking the Sabbath or receives ridicule or becomes the isolated person. Jesus, our Saviour takes on our sins so that we are saved from them!



Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46

A reading from the book of Leviticus

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived.
